

Betty Efferson—artist...

On a whim, Betty Efferson at the age of 60, while still busy running the clock business owned by her husband and herself, registered for a one-day oil painting class. Understand, that up until that time, although she was always doing some sort of "craft" or creative project, Betty had been somewhat disappointed/frustrated by her ventures into "art" because, she just could not seem to follow instructions to "stay within the lines."





ward, in the end, the instructor's comments: "you have your own distinct style and energy to your work. Do not ever let anyone discourage you from painting 'your' way, paint what you feel." That was 20+ years ago. Unbeknownst to Betty, that experience would be the start of a journey of artistic passion and travel. And to this day Betty is painting "her" way, from the heart – and outside of the lines.

We have all heard "practice makes perfect," and in keeping with that advice from many instructors, so too does Betty practice her craft. She paints every day – either in her home studio or at Studio 9170 where she rents studio space along with 15 other local artists, several of whom are AGL members. Betty says she tries to make it to Studio 9170 five days a week, but if she cannot make it, she paints at home and regularly paints eight hours a day.

Betty paints primarily in pastels, acrylics, and oils but, if she decides to, she throws in a little ink, wax crayon, oil stick or whatever else takes her fancy to energize her paintings. She has works on paper as well as canvas. She says she is always "changing it up" because she enjoys the challenges of trying new things, new mediums/techniques/ideas. She refers to her work today as "abstract expressionism." At one time she painted a lot from photo references; today she may take a photo so she doesn't forget a subject or a place, but the painting never follows or looks like the photo...in fact oftentimes it is unrecognizable. Now, instead of referencing a photo, she references a feeling evoked by the photo. She no longer begins with a sketch or even a color scheme in mind. Betty says often when a subject or thought comes to her mind it appears a color and she just goes with it. She now approaches a blank piece of canvas (or paper) with a brush in hand and simply begins "mark making." There were multiple canvases in her studio "marked up" waiting to see where her intuitive energy will take her on each one.



"Coloring outside the lines" has brought Betty much success in the art world. She is a mostly self-taught artist and travels extensively for exhibits and workshops. She is a national and international award winner. She is a three-time award winner in the Pastel Society of America's Annual International Show "Enduring Brilliance" and each of those art works were selected to be on exhibit at the Butler Institute of American Art in Ohio. She has also been awarded three residencies in New Smyrna Beach, Florida, at the Atlantic Center for Art. Betty was , most recently, awarded an Honorable Mention in the annual Pastel 100 Exhibit by Pastel Journal. (You can see the winning painting in Member News section of this newsletter.)



It is Betty's hope that viewers of her art do not merely see a pretty piece of art on canvas or paper but, that they are drawn into the work, that they feel an emotional connection and somehow experience the energy that has gone into the piece. Her long term goal is to have work in public spaces, to perhaps connect with interior designers and to have her work displayed in a high-end gallery.

In addition to being active locally with Associated Women in the Art and Degas Pastel Society, Betty has been a long time member of the Guild. As a member of AGL Workshop Committee she has been instrumental in bringing, award winning oil instructors, such as Pam Ingalls and Bill Schneider, to our workshops.

51st Annual River Road Show -- Back on Track!

After an unprecedented cancellation due to the pandemic in 2020, AGL's historic annual national River Road Show is back for 2021. We are honored to have been able to reschedule nationally acclaimed watercolor artist/instructor, Soon Warren, as the judge/juror for the show. She will also conduct a 3 day workshop at the Studio in the Park. The prospectus and entry form are updated and ready to accept entries on the Guild website www.artguildlouisiana.org/river-road-show. The deadline for entry is Thursday, May 13, 2021. The show opens on August 3, 2021 and extends through October 3 (Early voting occurs at Archives from Friday, October 1 thru Sunday, October 3.) The exhibit take-down will occur on Monday, October 4, 2021.

Tuesday Open Studios Are Back

As of March 16, 2021 the Studio in the Park is once again open on Tuesdays from 11:00am – 4:00pm, for open studio. Enjoy networking with other artists and getting peer feedback, if desired. Artists are welcome to work in all mediums except oils.

Too many distractions at home to find time to focus on your painting passion? Come create art work for a couple of hours or all day at the Studio in the Park, 2490 Silverest Avenue, Baton Rouge. The studio is a great workspace with good lighting, 8 foot long work tables, a cabinet full of items to set up a still life, an extensive art reference library and is equipped with a refrigerator and microwave.

Pastel Open Studio

If you have been interested in trying out pastels, this is a great place to do so. Network with other artists working in pastel; exchange tips, ideas and conversation. If you would like to "try out" the pastel medium without the investment in a new medium, the studio has an assortment of "community" pastels that we are willing to share, but, you will need to bring your own paper. No fees, no registrationjust show up.

On the 4th Thursday of each month from 11:00-3:00 the Guild invites members interested in working in pastels to join and connect with like-minded artists. Visiting artists are not required to work in pastels. Although this open studio is geared to pastel artists, other mediums are also welcome, except no oils.

REMINDER: Occasionally open studios may be cancelled due to scheduling conflicts with workshops. Always check the website Calendar for the latest in scheduling changes.

Picture Day

Picture Day will continue to follow the new process until further notice: Members who want to have paintings photographed must drop off paintings at the Studio in the Park Tuesday or Wednesday before Picture Day (the 3rd Sunday) between 11:00 am -3:30 pm and can pick up their paintings the following Tuesday or Wednesday between 11:00 am -3:30 pm. Occasionally Picture Day is not on the 3^{rd} Sunday due to a conflict. Picture Day Sunday for the entire year of 2021 is scheduled on the website Events Calendar, www.artguildlouisiana.org/calendar. Face coverings are required in the studio and social distancing is practiced.

Betty's winning art piece was published in the Spring 2021 Issue of Pastel Journal.





Another painting sold! MARILYN GENSLER's painting "Flowers" that won the People's Choice ribbon in the Winter Member Show at Independence Park sold during the show. The new owner was very happy to have purchased a piece of art that ended up being an "award winning" piece of art. In addition to the live exhibit AGL also ran the show as a virtual exhibit on the AGL Facebook, allowing visitors to vote on their favorite painting.

Congratulations to AGL member, **DAVID GARY**, who was juried into this year's, Plein Air Competition at the Shadows on the Teche in New Iberia, a week long plein air painting competition. For the week of March 13-19 David had the opportunity to do daily plein air painting in any of 7 surrounding parishes. In addition to a full week of painting the event included attending painting demonstrations by Ken Backhaus, a shrimp fest and other activities. The week culminates with an award ceremony and sale of the art works completed during the week, held at the Shadows Visitor Center. This is the third year David has been accepted into the competition.





In the October issue, of News from the Palette we shared with you the pandemic project of **BETTY GRAVOIS**. She challenged herself to complete a painting/drawing a day during the "shut down". At the time of that printing she was up to about 180 something pieces. As the pandemic appears to be slowing due to vaccinations, and people are once again being allowed to come together, we revisited Betty to check in on her project. Betty shared with us, four journals completely filled with sketches, studies of art works by well- known artists and full color paintings. She now has completed 314 daily drawings/paintings and 15 studio pieces. Her new challenge—3 small paintings a week...an inspiration to us all!

This is a non-juried exhibit, which means that there is no selection process. Artists interested in exhibiting must bring their entries to the Independence Park Theater on May 13, 2021, between 11:00am and 1:00pm. All art work must meet the Art Guild of Louisiana Exhibit Requirements found at www.artguildlouisiana.org/ exhibits .

A total of \$400 in cash awards and 2 Honorable Mention ribbons will be presented at an awards ceremony on Sunday, June 6, 2021 from 2:00 – 4:00pm. Face coverings required and social distancing practiced.

ticipants will do their own painting in order to fully understand the process. While concentrating on technique, the concept of color theory, composition and color values will also be included in the workshop.
