## **IT'S ELECTION TIME!!!**

The Art Guild of Louisiana has been providing exhibit and education opportunities to area artists since 1953. And now it is again time for someone else to step up and lead our organization on the journey of connecting art and people in our community. Our Board is very team-oriented and committed to supporting each other for the success of AGL. It is up to all of us to continue the legacy of our founding artists.



Be in the know; put your ideas and visions for art in Baton Rouge to work with a whole team to support and carry out new ideas. Being an AGL Board member is also a great way to make contacts with other local art organizations and artists. AGL has an average membership of 150 members annually. Feeling a little reluctant to "step up" by yourself....team up with a friend and volunteer for both positions. Together with other supporting Board members, you will find lots of support and enthusiasm.

The Board positions to be filled, President and Secretary are 2-year terms that will run from January 2021 -December 31, 2022. The Board holds meetings every two (2) months, usually at the Studio in the Park. The meetings generally run 2 hours, and are currently held on Thursdays from 1:30 – 3:30. General responsibilities of the two offices follow:

**President:** responsible for the directing and coordinating activities and business of the Art Guild of Louisiana; compose/implement agenda for and preside over Board meetings, serves as ex-officio member of all committees; oversee Guild activities with the support of committee members and fellow Board members.

**Secretary**: take minutes at Board meetings, finalize minutes with Board, sign off on final minutes and file final in minutes binder; maintain current contact list for Board members; check messages remotely on Guild phone once a week and forward to Board for handling; and provides support to the President as needed for meetings.

Much of Board's tasks and responsibilities can be accomplished from home via computer and/or phone on a flexible schedule convenient to your life.

Art Guild of Louisiana is exhibiting their **Summer Judged Show** at the Louisiana State Archives building on Essen Lane from August 10, 2020 to September 25, 2020. The exhibit is free of admission and open to the public during regular business hours Monday-Friday.

The top 3 winners receive a cash award plus a ribbon: 1<sup>st</sup> Place - \$175, 2<sup>nd</sup> Place - \$150, 3<sup>rd</sup> Place \$75; also, 2 honorable mention ribbons will be awarded.

The awards presentation will be held on Thursday, September 17, 2020 from 5:00-7:00 pm. Exhibiting artists are encouraged to attend. Due to pandemic guidelines we ask that you only invite family member or members of your household. We will practice social distancing and/or whatever guidelines are set forth by our government officials at that time.

Join artist Alan Flattmann for an informative landscape and cityscape workshop that will hone your skills as an artist. This workshop will concentrate on painting in an impressionistic manner using broken color and loose brush strokes. Students may choose to work in pastel or oil. Alan stresses the basic principles of composition, drawing, color and technique that apply to any style of representational painting. His goal is to teach a sound and fundamental approach with an emphasis on painting in a well-planned, organized way. He will show how to paint creatively from photos and directly from nature. You will enjoy frequent demonstrations in addition to individual guidance and critiques.

Alan Flattmann is a Pastel Society of America Hall of Fame Honoree and a recipient of the American Artist Art Masters Award for Pastel Teacher. His work is the subject of four books.
