CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The AGL Board is looking for volunteers to participate on the Board. As an all-volunteer organization, it is up to each of us to continue the legacy of our founding fathers in supporting and promoting local artists. New faces and new ideas keep the Guild up to date and viable to the Baton Rouge art community.

Put your ideas of how the Guild can contribute to the Baton Rouge arts landscape to work with our team to support and help bring them to life. Being an AGL Board member is a great way to make contacts with other local

art organizations and artists. Feeling a little reluctant to "step up" by yourself? Team up with a friend to help you, or nominate someone you know who would be great.

The Board positions to be filled: **Vice President** and **Treasurer.** Terms are 2 years, from January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2023. Board meetings are every two months, at the Studio in the Park. Meetings generally run two hours, and are currently on the third Thursday, from 1:30 – 3:30. Annually in January, the Board meeting is combined with a planning "retreat" session on Saturday from 9:00-4:00, away from the Studio. It's a fun session.

General responsibilities of the two positions to be filled are:

Vice President: The Vice President generally serves at the leisure of the President, presides at Board meetings and may assume the duties of the President in his/her absence, attends regular Board meetings held every other month; may attend committee meetings on behalf of the President; may assume or assist on special projects at his/her discretion (Examples of duties/projects that some past VPs have assumed are Exhibit Coordinator at Independence Park Theatre Gallery; recruitment of judges for Independence Park judged exhibits (3 per year); maintained budget comparison reports to present to the Board, inputting specific financial data as a member of the "finance team".)

Treasurer: The Treasurer is not solely responsible for every facet of the Guild's finances. The Treasurer is actually the lead person over a "finance support team" consisting of three volunteers, each having a specific area of responsibility: 1) deposits, 2) PayPal reconciliation, 3) transaction posting. The Treasurer produces monthly financial reports, using QuickBooks, to be presented officially at the Board meeting every two months. The team approach provides the Guild with a more reliable, less questionable process for year-end reporting and makes the Treasurer duties much more manageable.

Most Board member tasks/responsibilities can be accomplished from home via computer/phone and/or on a flexible schedule convenient to the Board member's life.

51st RIVER ROAD SHOW

Congratulations to all of the artists who were accepted into the 51st River Road Show. For those of you who missed the "numbers" in the June newsletter, AGL is excited about the 2021 response to the River Road Show Call for Entry. A total of 110 artists submitted 343 pieces of art in hopes of being one of the 70 final selections.

The final selections include 17 out of state artists and a great showing for Louisiana artists, including the following AGL member artists: Claudia LeJeune, Steve Shamburger, Kathy Miller Stone, Judi Betts, Carol Creel, Kay Wallace, Cheryl Caro, Jo McWilliams, Mark Boudreaux, Lana Bernard Toniolo, Betty Efferson, Deana Evstefeeva, Cheri Fry, Tracy Hebert, Gary Green, Amanda Miller, Dana Mosby, Olivia Pass, Noel Poche', Nancy Stutes, and Doris Truman.

The take-in and installation is August 2-3 with the exhibit opening on August 4. The exhibit will be open and free for public viewing through September 30. The take-down and artwork pick-up date is October 4, 11:00 -1:00. An awards ceremony and reception is scheduled for Friday, September 10, 5:00 – 7:00pm.

Note: Mask restrictions for all events will be observed in accordance with the public/facility policy in place at the time of the event.

This program is a 2021 Ebb & Flow Festival event and is made possible in part by a grant from the Arts Council of Greater Baton Rouge, funded by the East Baton Rouge Parish Mayor-President and the Metro Council. We are very appreciative to have received an Ebb & Flow Festival grant award and for the River Road Show to be included as an Ebb & Flow event.

3rd AGL Annual Art Trunk & Tent Sale—Save the Date

The Guild has previously sponsored two annual Art Trunk/Tent sales (2018 & 2019) under the Oak trees on the grounds of Independence Park Theatre. The trunk sale event was initiated by the Guild as the result of a member suggestion. The idea was to give members/local artists an opportunity to do an end of year inventory clear out, while at the same time, giving local residents an opportunity to scoop up original art and other artisan made gift items at "bargain" prices just before the holidays.

We feel like both previous events were well supported by artist vendors from both AGL members and several nonmember vendors. We are currently in the early planning stages for the 3rd AGL Annual Art Trunk & Tent Sale. More details will be made available in August via member emails.

The currently scheduled dates are October 9, 2021, 10:00am - 2:00pm, with an alternate rain date of October 23, 2021. So, save the date and get that inventory ready to move on to a new home.

Grant Awards

As all of you know the Guild experienced a devastating financial blow in 2020 due to the COVID shutdown and was forced to make some tough decisions to cut costs. And 2021 did not start out looking much better. AGL wants to express their appreciation to the members who generously donated. Our membership has finally reached a more normal level and our workshops are getting back on track. We want to especially thank Guild members Kathy Redmond, Kay Bailey and Betty Gravois who volunteered their time to conduct mini workshops with all of the proceeds going to the Guild.

Guild Board members have also been busy trying to generate dollars. Leah Schwartzman, Kathy Redmond, Claudia Lejeune, and Barbara Andrepont pooled their resources to submit two grant applications. Those efforts paid off. AGL has been awarded \$2,000 from the NEA CARES Act Grant through the Louisiana Division of the Arts and funded by the National Endowment for the Arts. The Guild also received a \$1,000 award from the Ebb and Flow Festival grant administered by the Arts Council of Greater Baton Rouge and funded by the EBR Parish Mayor President and the Metro Council. As a "project grant" the money from this grant is earmarked to help fund the River Road Show. It also entitles the River Road Show to be listed and promoted as an Ebb and Flow Festival event. We are very thankful for these awards.

Art Reference Library – Please return checked out books



Call for Entry - Autumn Judged Show

The Art Guild of Louisiana is calling for art for the Autumn Judged Show. The exhibit will be open from September 9, 2021 through November 11, 2021 at the Independence Park Theater Gallery, 7800 Independence Blvd, Baton Rouge. This is a non-juried exhibit, however, all artwork must meet the AGL exhibit requirements. To ensure that your artwork will be accepted at the take-in, you should review the entry information below and the "Installation & Originality Requirements" at www.artguildlouisiana.org/exhibits.

- Open to all artists, members and non-members, at least 18 years of age. All original 2 dimensional media is eligible except photography, prints, giclées, and computer generated/enhanced artwork. We encourage all media including oil, acrylic, watercolor, fluid ink, graphite, colored pencil, pen & ink, original lithograph, mixed media, pastel, gouache, encaustic, etc.
- **Entry Fee** members \$10 per painting / non-AGL members \$20 per entry. Maximum of five paintings.
- **Prizes Awarded** 1st: \$175; 2nd: \$150 and 3rd: \$75, each place winner will receive cash and a ribbon; two Honorable Mention ribbons will be awarded.

- Take-in -September 9 Interested artists should bring artwork to the Independence Park Theatre Gallery, 7800 Independence Park Blvd, Baton Rouge on September 9 between 11:00 am - 1:00 pm.
- Pick-up November 11 Artwork must be picked up between 11:00 am 1:00 pm. A \$25 transport/ storage fee will be assessed to artists whose work is not picked up on November 11. Artist pickup slips are distributed at each exhibit and it is the responsibility of the artist to keep track of the pickup date: no further notice will be sent out.
- **Reception** Sunday October 3, 2021, from 2:00 pm 4:00 pm. All receptions are open to the public; please invite your friends and family. Exhibiting artists are encouraged to attend the reception and bring a finger food for the snack table.
- Artwork sold is subject to a 20% BREC commission fee. All artwork must remain in the exhibit until the take-down date - November 11.

If you enjoy working in watercolor this is a workshop not to miss. Soon Warren is widely known for her skills in the use of color, light and contrast.





instructor, workshop participants will do their own painting in order to fully understand the process. While concentrating on technique, the concept of color theory, composition and color values will also be included in the workshop.






