Getting to Know William "Bill" Buck

From chemical engineer to multitalented artist, Bill says he retired from his left-brained career in 2019 and hasn't looked back sense.

Stirrings of Bill's artistic interests presented itself as a penchant for child-hood doodling. In 2014, he was gifted some drawing pencils and a sketch-book and that basically lit the match that started artistic fires. Shortly after, he began taking watercolor classes and portraiture classes with the late Larry Casso. That mentorship with Larry turned out to be the key that kick-started Bill's life as an artist.



Although Bill has not formally studied art or received a degree from a university, he does not consider himself to be self-taught due to his lessons with Larry Casso and many other fine artists that he has had the opportunity to travel and study with in workshops. And, he has also taken advantage of workshops at the Guild whenever possible.

Bill primarily works in watercolor, pastel, or acrylic, but leans more towards his enjoyment of watercolor. Bill says "the benefit of watercolor paper is that there are two sides. If you fail, just flip it and use the B side. If the B side fails, paint it with gesso and use it for acrylic. If the acrylic fails, then use it for your fireplace starter." Recently, he began incorporating airbrushing watercolor or acrylic into some of his art pieces.

During the pandemic Bill became involved with the International Society of Caricature Artists (ISCA) and attended weekly sessions called Caricature BBQ via Discord (a remote access program like Zoom). Post pandemic, he has continued with the remote sessions and now sometimes leads them himself. He enjoys connecting with the tremendous group of digital and traditional artists through this organization. In November 2021 he attended the ISCA annual convention and competition in Las Vegas and is looking forward to attending again this November in Orlando, Florida.

Bill mostly uses an iPad and Procreate for his caricature work, and he also finds himself using it as a planning tool, particularly for value studies for his traditional art pieces. He sees the unfortunate bias by many art organizations to shy away from digital artwork as a missed opportunity for many artists.



Over the past year or so Bill has seen his work change significantly; from doing realistic subjects and landscapes to doing more abstract expressionism and stylized abstract work. He says that change has been very rewarding. Bill says abstract work is "a great way to convey emotion and energy in his art. For the first time, I felt truly pleased with my work." He discovered that even in abstract work, the principles of design and composition still apply. A combination of small and large shapes, linear and nonlinear lines, soft and hard edges, dark and light value contrasts are necessary for a successful abstract piece.



Whereas Bill previously shied away from larger paintings, he is now working in larger format, full sheet watercolor abstracts. For him, the larger pieces seem to make more of a statement when framed and displayed.

Bill's tips: Bill strives to make time for painting or drawing "something" every day. It's his belief that daily practice is important to maintain your muscle memory and stay on focus. He always carries a sketchbook on his travels.

It's important to develop technical skills of how to apply paint and so forth. For technical skills you need coaching and advice from others, but paint what's in "your" imagination and heart. Don't chase the style of other artists. Make art that pleases "you" personally. And do not take all the advice you receive too seriously, choose what works for you.


Lastly Bill shares that he is immensely proud to have been instrumental in helping to create the official Baton Rouge Chapter of Urbansketchers four years ago. Urbansketchers meets monthly to sketch at random locations in the Baton Rouge area. Call for Entry - Autumn Judged Show - September 2022

The Art Guild of Louisiana is calling for art for the Autumn Judged Show. The exhibit will be open September 8 through November 10 at the Independence Park Theatre Gallery, 7800 Independence Boulevard, Baton Rouge. The exhibit is open to all 2- dimensional artists age 18 and up. Photography, giclees, computer enhanced images/prints and other non-original media will not be accepted.

This is a non-juried exhibit, however, all artwork must meet the AGL exhibit requirements. Please read the "Installation & Originality Requirements" at www.artguildlouisiana.org/exhibit-requirements

- Open to all artists, at least 18 years of age. All original 2-dimensional media is eligible except photography, prints, giclées, and computer generated/enhanced artwork. We encourage all media including oil, acrylic, watercolor, fluid ink, graphite, colored pencil, pen & ink, original lithograph, mixed media, pastel, gouache, encaustic, etc.
- The **Entry Fee**: AGL members \$10 per entry; non-AGL members \$20 per entry. Maximum of five pieces.
- **Prizes Awarded** 1st: \$175; 2nd: \$150 and 3rd: \$75, each place winner will receive cash and a ribbon; two Honorable Mention ribbons will be awarded.
- **Take-in -September 8, 2022 -** Interested artists should bring artwork to the Independence Park Theatre Gallery, 7800 Independence Park Blvd, Baton Rouge between 11:00 am 1:00 pm.
- Pick-up November 10, 2022 Artwork must be picked up between 11:00 am 1:00 pm. A \$25 transport/storage fee will be assessed to artists whose work is not picked up. Reminder slips are distributed to each artist at take-in. It is the responsibility of the artist to keep track of the pickup date; no further notice will be sent out.
- Award Reception Friday, September 30, 2022, from 2:00 pm 4:00 pm. All receptions are open to
 the public; please invite your friends and family. Exhibiting artists are encouraged to attend the reception and bring a finger food for the snack table.
- Art works sold are subject to a 20% BREC commission fee. All artwork must remain in the exhibit until the take-down date – November 10, 2022.

mentored by Italian Master Painter Ronato Casaro in the early 90's. Frank is an award-winning artist and conducts workshops locally, nationally and internationally.
