CALL FOR NOMINATIONS!

With a special thanks to the many volunteers who came before us, the Art Guild of Louisiana is celebrating its **70**th year of promoting art and artists in Baton Rouge. We are thankful to our current Board Members, most of whom have been serving for several years in various positions to ensure the continuance of the AGL legacy.

Nominations for **Vice President** and **Treasurer** open August 1, 2023. As an all-volunteer, member-driven organization we are looking to YOU our fellow artist members. If you care about promoting Baton Rouge artists; if you are passionate about providing ongoing exhibit and development opportunities for local art-



ists, we invite you to take an active role. Give back to the organization that has been giving to you by volunteering your time on our leadership team. Or nominate someone you know who has new ideas and is passionate about contributing to the art community.

Vice President and Treasurer are each two-year terms beginning January 1, 2024-December 31, 2025. Board meetings are held once every two (2) months, at the Studio in the Park, currently on the third Thursday, from 11:00–1:00. We have one day-long Annual Meeting (usually in January) on a Saturday, 9:00–4:00, which combines a morning planning session (potluck breakfast and lunch) with an afternoon Board meeting. These are always lots of fun! Good food! And there are prizes!

Vice President: The Vice President generally serves at the leisure of the President, may preside at Board meetings or assume other duties of the President in his/her absence, attends regular Board meetings, may attend committee meetings on behalf of the President; may assume or assist on projects they have a special interest in.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is the lead person over a financial team of three volunteers, each responsible for a specific area: 1) deposits, 2) PayPal reconciliation, and 3) transaction posting. The Treasurer then compiles and produces monthly financial reports (using QuickBooks), to be presented at the Board meeting. This team-approach strengthens the accuracy and accountability of the process and assures that the reporting has a stronger system of checks and balances for the budgeting process. This also relieves the Treasurer of some of the tedious daily task work.

With few exceptions, technology makes tasks accomplishable from home on a flexible schedule that is convenient to our busy schedules.



Currently on exhibit and open to the public at Independence Park Theatre Gallery is the AGL's annual Workshop Show. This show is a one of a kind opportunity that allows artists to exhibit artwork created in a workshop or classroom setting.

Some artwork not created in a workshop is also on exhibit. Check out the exhibit of 22 talented local artists showcasing 35 works in charcoal, watercolor, oil, and more and cast a vote for your favorite piece of art. Then join us on August 6 between 2:00 and 4:00 pm to see who takes home the People's Choice Ribbon.

There will also be a random drawing for \$25 for the exhibiting artists. Exhibiting artists get one "chance" to win for each piece of artwork entered. We encourage exhibiting artists to attend the reception and bring a finger food for the refreshment table. Invite your family and friends to enjoy the art and camaraderie.

Call for Entry – Autumn Judged Show – September 14 – November 9

This is a non-juried exhibit, however, **all entries must meet the AGL exhibit requirements**. To ensure that your artwork will be accepted at the take-in, you should read "Installation & Originality Requirements" at www.artguildlouisiana.org/exhibit-requirements.

- Open to all artists, members and non-members, at least 18 years of age. All original 2 dimensional media is eligible except photography, prints, giclées, and computer generated/enhanced artwork. We encourage all media including oil, acrylic, watercolor, fluid ink, graphite, colored pencil, pen & ink, original lithograph, mixed media, pastel, gouache, encaustic, etc.
- Entry Fee: members \$10 per painting/non-AGL members \$20 per painting. Maximum of five paintings.
- **Prizes Awarded** 1st \$175; 2nd \$150 and 3rd \$75. Each place winner will receive cash and a ribbon; two Honorable Mention ribbons will be awarded.
- **Take-in -September 14** Interested artists should bring artwork to the Independence Park Theatre Gallery, 7800 Independence Park Blvd, Baton Rouge on Thursday, September 14 between 11:00 am 1:00 pm.
- **Pickup November 9 -** Artwork must be picked up between 11:00 am 1:00 pm. It is the artist's responsibility to keep track of the pickup date; no further notice will be sent out. A \$25 transport/storage fee will be assessed to artists whose work is it is not picked up.
- Reception Sunday, October 15, from 2:00 4:00 pm. All receptions are open to the public; please invite friends and family. Exhibiting artists are encouraged to attend the reception and bring a finger food for the snack table.
- Artworks sold are subject to a 20% BREC commission fee. All artwork must remain in the exhibit until the take-down date November 9
- Neither BREC, not the Guild, are liable for damage, loss, or theft.

NOTE: Early registration for workshops is the KEY to whether or not a workshop actually gets to take place. Instructors have schedules and arrangements that must be taken into consideration. So please take advantage of the early bird discount and register early!

Positive painting – painting an actual subject or object, like painting a tree. Negative painting – painting the background around an object, like painting the sky around the shape of a tree or a building before you paint the actual object. Both of these techniques are critical to the watercolor artist. In this class you will paintalong with Roberta using a variety of washes, building up the painting, watching the main object emerge from the background.
